



Two Students Awarded Scholarships on College Night

TAMPA, Fla (April 15, 2013) Chemical engineering students, **Cheryl McCane** and **Kathleen Baumback**, were each presented with a \$1,500 scholarship by the Central Florida chapter of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers. The group awards four scholarships each year to declared chemical engineering students at the University of South Florida, University of Florida, University of Central Florida or Florida Institute of Technology or be a resident of Central Florida, an area defined between latitude 27 degrees and 29 degrees.

Selection is based upon academic achievement, involvement in AIChE and other extracurricular activites.

The University of South Florida is a high-impact, global research university dedicated to student success. USF is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in the top tier of research universities, a distinction attained by only 2.2 percent of all universities. The Carnegie Foundation also classifies USF as a community engaged university.
