The seventh and final stage of the semester project is the *final paper*. Here are the parameters:

- It is due on Wednesday, May 6, by 4:45 PM.
- The final paper will count for 50% of your project grade as explained in the "project overview" document.
- Each group should submit:
 - o one electronic copy (MS Word or PDF), sent to me via e-mail (cunning@usf.edu); and
 - o one electronic copy via Canvas, which will be checked for plagiarism.
- Follow the style of one of the journals previously indicated (see instructions for reference list). Use that journal's style for things like cover page, citations, figure captions, table headers, section headers, reference list, etc. Try to make your paper "look like" the journal that you are mimicking. (...but only print your paper in a single column, not double-column; also double-space your paper.)
- On the first page, give the paper's title and author information. Mimic the style of your selected journal.
- On the second page, provide an abstract and, if your selected journal uses key words, provide key words following the abstract. Mimic the style of your selected journal.
- On the third page, begin the main text of your paper.
- Double-space your paper, including the reference list.
- Paginate your rough draft. The title page should be page 1.
- You must include at least 10 references. Web sites don't count towards your 10. You must give
 complete bibliographic citation for your references, using proper format for the citations. The
 references can be the same ones you submitted previously, or you can make changes from your
 previous list.
- I will grade your papers according to the rubric that I posted previously. The maximum score is 50, but really anything above 40 is pretty good, based on the way that I grade.
- If you plagiarize, all group members will fail the class for the semester. You might want to double- or triple-check your group members' work to be sure it is not plagiarized.
