The sixth and final part of the second paper assignment is the *final draft* of your paper. Here are the parameters:

- It is due on Tuesday, April 30, at <u>9:45 AM</u>. It is fine if you want to submit the paper early, e.g., on Monday, April 29.
- The final paper counts for 50% of the project grade.
- Each student should submit one hard copy, stapled or bound, *and* should upload an electronic copy to Canvas. The electronic copy will be checked for plagiarism.
- Submit the hard copy to the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, room ENC 3300, on the third floor of the Engineering III building. Go there during regular business hours (between 9 AM and 5 PM). There will be a student helper behind the desk in the departmental office. Ask the student helper to time-stamp your paper and put it in my mailbox. (I will collect them at 9:46 AM on my way to the airport.)
- Format and length should adhere to the guidelines described previously. Use APA style, including double spacing. It is fine to use double-sided printing (save paper).
- APA style says that you should include a title page on p 1, include an abstract on p 2, and begin your text on p 3. For this paper, you can omit the abstract. Include the title page as p 1, then begin your text on p 2.
- Check APA style if you are including figures or tables. It is a good idea to include figures or tables, but please adhere to APA style for these, and also be sure to cite your sources. Among other things, APA style says that figures and tables should be at the back of the paper.
- You must cite at least 10 sources/references. Web sites don't count towards your 10. You must give complete bibliographic citation for your references, using proper format (APA format) for the citations. The references can be the same ones you submitted previously, or you can make changes from your previous list.
- Your final papers will be evaluated on the 10 criteria listed in the ENV 2073 *writing rubric*. The rubric is posted on Canvas, explaining each of the 10 criteria and guiding you on how to make your paper as strong as you can.
